Letter from the President

Dear Members and Friends of GJH,

Welcome to our first Annual Report! We hope this adds transparency to our organization, and please, if you have any questions or comments feel free to reach out to me.

The Covid-19 pandemic brought several changes to our organization. We learned to use Zoom, and now simulcast our lectures from the Teton County Library. We also use Zoom to record our lectures, which is a major simplification from the days of Elizabeth Kingwill using a tripod mounted video camera! In 2022 the Library created a formal application process to reserve the auditorium monthly for a year. They also restricted all organizations to one reservation per month. Our application was successful, and we secured the first Tuesday of the month (with an occasional exception).

If you have been to one of our lectures recently you will know that we have started serving appetizers and soft drinks from 5:30-6:00. The intent is to create a social time for mingling and to draw more people to our talks in person. So far it seems to be very popular!

Finally, many thanks to our Board of Directors and Friends who volunteer their time to make our programs happen! And thanks to you for your financial support, which enables our programs.

Corporate News

- In 2023 we added a new Board Director, **Bill Newcomb**. Welcome Bill!
- Annual Meeting was held on December 5th, 2023 at the Teton County Library.
- **First Amendment to Bylaws** was unanimously approved by the Board, and subsequently approved by 2/3 of the Members in December of 2023. This amendment changes GJH from a Member voting organization to a Board voting organization.

Why change our bylaws?

٠

- 1. Simplification. Every year our Bylaws require our Members to vote on Board Directors, among other things. This is very time consuming for us to administer. We now have ~160 Members who each need to be emailed a ballot, sent a reminder or two to vote until we get a majority, and then every vote tracked and recorded. That is hundreds of emails to keep track of!
- Customary structure. Member voting is not a common structure for nonprofit organizations such as ours. More common is that only the Board of Directors vote (called a "self-perpetuating" board governance structure). https://charitylawyerblog.com/2011/04/26/nonprofit-law-jargon-buster-voting-members-vs-self-perpetuating-boards/. We are analogous to a museum in this case. Furthermore, we have never had more than one person run for each Board seat. And every year since 2012 our Members have voted according to the recommendations of the Board.
- 3. This change means fewer emails sent to you from GJH!
- **Director Elections:** the Members also approved the following appointments to the Board; **Robert I. Tilling, Mike Scher** and **Cynthia Blankenship.**
- Elizabeth Kingwill, a Board Director since 2014, has declined to run again for her board seat. Elizabeth has a long history living in Jackson Hole, and an intellectual curiosity that led her to participating in GJH programming in the late 2000s. She began attending our then thrice monthly lecture series and offered to contribute to our efforts to bring science to our community. As GJH recognized this she was invited to join the GJH board and was a dedicated member of the board for more than a decade.

While the entire board saw the value of videotaping our lectures and making them available for people who could not attend in person, Elizabeth was the only one with the determination, interest and drive to make it happen. It was not easy, but she persevered and extended our science outreach by probably two orders of magnitude. Also, despite her misgivings, she taught Yellowstone Geology classes in the Jackson Hole Middle School, where she did an excellent job, of course. Elizabeth was always there, always engaged, and always positive about what she offered. Her contributions have been an important part of what GJH brings to our community, and her contributions at board meetings were always insightful and helpful.




Sources of Funds: \$27,485
